## II. ACS 2022 Rocky Mountain Regional mini-Meeting, Friday, November 4, 2022

Abstracts are being accepted for the 2022 Rocky Mountain Regional mini-Meeting to be held on November 4, 2022, in Albuquerque, NM. The 2022 RMRM symposium sessions (both oral and poster) will address a range of chemistry and chemical engineering disciplines using the mini-meeting format to provide a cost-effective venue for young presenters as a service to our Members and provide an opportunity for the Central New Mexico Local Section to celebrate its 75th anniversary.

During the meeting, a Química symposium will be held in which presentations are delivered in Spanish, continuing a successful practice from the 2021 RMRM in Tucson, AZ. The 2022 RMRM is also being scheduled in conjunction with the New Mexico Research Symposium being organized by the New

Mexico Academy of Science (www.nmas.org) and New Mexico EPSCoR (www.nmepscor.org) which is scheduled for Saturday, November 5, 2022, in Albuquerque, NM.

Patrick Burton and Dayton (Jon) Vogel, both with Sandia National Laboratory, are serving as General Chair and Program Chair, respectively, and may be contacted for further information.
