#### News.

- Sue Clark (WSU) was awarded the Garvin-Olin Medal by the American Chemical Society. This award is given annually to one person to "recognize the distinguished service to chemistry by women in chemistry". The award was established in 1936, and this is the 2<sup>nd</sup> time that a WIBS member has received this award, the other awardee being Jeann'ne Shreve in 1972.
- WIBS has been awarded an Innovative Project Grant for 2012 to support a public scientific forum on energy production from the Alberta Oil Sands. - Kirk Peterson (WSU) was elected a fellow of the AAAS. Prof. Peterson was noted for his development of basis sets and reliable property predictions.
- Nadine Abdel-Rahim, a 5<sup>th</sup> grade student from Lena Whitmore Elementary (Moscow) was a winner of the ACS illustrated Earth Day poetry competition at the National Level.
