Dear Mr. Kroll:

I take pleasure in informing you officially that the Council of the American Chemical Society at its meeting in New York, N. Y., on September 11, 1944, voted to grant a charter to a new local section to be known as the Wabash Valley Section. The territory is to comprise the Counties of Clay, Knox, Parke, Sullivan, Vermillion, and Vigo in the State of Indiana, and the Counties of Clark, Crawford, Edgar, and Lawrence in the State of Illinois, with headquarters at Terre Haute, Indiana, as requested in the application from members within the territory.

Enclosed you will find the charter for the new section.

I am also sending you herewith a list of members in your section. Will you please see that this is turned over to the Secretary of the Section as soon as elected. Also, please inform us as soon as possible of the result of your election of officers so that we may record their names and also send to the chairman and secretary particularly information which they should have in carrying out the duties of their respective offices as they relate to this office.

You will note from the enclosed list that there are 104 members in your section, three of whom have not paid their 1944 dues. On the basis of this count you are entitled to elect two councilors for 1944. Councilors take office as of January 1, so that the individuals elected to this office at this time would serve until December 31, 1944. The term of newly elected or reelected councilors must begin January 1, 1945. This is in accordance with Article 7, Sec. 5(c) of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Society.
