US National Chemistry Olympiad 2013


The Western Michigan ACS and Grand Valley State University hosted the National Chemistry Olympiad Local Section Competition (Thursday, March 28th) and National Examination (Saturday, April 13th) at GVSU. With no restriction on the number of students, the primary goals of this program are to stimulate interest and achievement in chemistry and to provide recognition for outstanding chemistry students, teachers, and schools. This year we had 5 local high schools participate bringing 30 students to the Local Competition and 7 students were invited to compete in the National Examination, with 5 choosing to compete.

Blair Miller, Jessica Vanden Plas and Randy Winchester organized the two events. The Local Section Exam was a written exam held at the GVSU Kirkhoff center and the National Exam was both a written exam as well as a laboratory exam held at the Chemistry Department. (continued on page 2)
